




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PREFACE

PROGRAMME DAY TO DAY


What is your age? 21 springs young


What year are you in?

Ella (she/her)


What is your age? I'm 19 years old

I was in the first year committee last year, which is great because it's not too much work and you can organize anything you want. I think the career or wellbeing committee would be fun to join as well.


If GSS did not exist, what would you be studying right now?

And guys: if you're doubting during the first few weeks give it some time, you'll definitely find your place:)

































CURRENT CHAIR OF STORM CLÉO DOREL-WATSON (SHE/HER)





HONORARY MEMBER: DETLEF VAN VUUREN

I have a confession to make and that is that I am extremely happy with the decision I made after high school to pursue the study of "Environmental Science" (as GSS was called at the time) at Utrecht. Interestingly enough in those days, environmental awareness was already on the rise, but with a very strong focus on various local pollution issues (around that time, the first National Environmental Program was also developed). In 1991, the opportunity finally arrived for me, my first year going to do "secondary university programme" Environmental Science, after enduring two years of "basic training" in a random other discipline (in my case, actually two studies – chemistry and public administration).

However, it's worth noting that compared to the current state of GSS, everything was still quite amateurish. This not only applied to the study itself but also to the organization surrounding it. It was the study itself that organized the introduction in the form of a camp (so teachers) and obviously, it had a nice valuable content-focused program, but as students, we realized that a social program was completely missing. And this marked the beginning of Storm... A group of students decided that it was worthwhile to seek connection as environmental science (now sustainability) students, and we came together to contemplate the idea of a student association. We envisioned an association that could assist us with social activities, facilitate connection through a newsletter, offer engaging lectures, and more. Within six months, Storm emerged as the association for Environmental Science students in Utrecht.

Personally, I had the privilege as the first Chairperson of Storm to lead the process of building Storm and witnessing its growth over the years. I believe that Storm can be an invaluable resource, extending beyond the formal curriculum during study time. It provides an avenue for connecting with likeminded students, offering relaxation, and fostering a pleasant and stimulating environment for personal development. At least, that's how I experienced it.

By the way, I have gotten very far in my career since the Storm days – at least in the literal sense. One of the reasons I chose to study environmental science was due to the reports of the Club of Rome, which as early as 1972, addressed issues like pollution and resource depletion using computer models. I found opportunities to conduct such research at the RIVM (in Bilthoven, near Utrecht) and later at the PBL. This enabled my involvement in IPCC, IPBES and various other UN organizations. These experiences also allowed me to reconnect with the department and study in Utrecht as a professor of Global Environmental Problems. In my opinion, my sustainability studies have proven to be valuable for me, not necessarily because of the precise knowledge gained, but mainly due to the interdisciplinary research skills and solution-oriented thinking fostered.

Therefore, I also believe you have made a wise decision to pursue a sustainability course in Utrecht. In fact, now, more than ever, we need well-trained and motivated individuals to address the current sustainability challenges facing our planet. We are confronted with (at least) a triple crisis related to climate change, biodiversity loss, and resource depletion/pollution. But we are still inequity and poverty at the same time. However, studies have also shown that there is much that can be done to manage these crises, which is why fresh and brilliant minds are essential. I hope to see you in the years to come. Make the most of your time as a student by learning from your studies themselves, but equally important, by developing yourself through Storm and regularly enjoying yourself

Welcome to Global Sustainability Science!

We're living in unprecedented and challenging times. The past three years have shown once more that humanity can only achieve sustainability when the environment, society and economy are in balance. Due to our far-stretching impact on environment and ecosystems and globalisation patterns, the coronavirus could rapidly cause a pandemic that has changed our way of living and economic activities drastically. Countries in lockdown have shown a remarkable drop in greenhouse gas emissions and air pollution, indicating that it is indeed possible to improve environmental quality. However, the quick return of air pollution in for example China also indicates that, from a sustainability perspective, 'back to normal' is not the preferred way to go.

At the same time, according to the World Economic Forum, the Russian invasion into Ukraine is having far reaching consequences in a variety of areas: the situation has evolved into a humanitarian crisis, has turned food and energy security volatile and raises questions about the architecture of global security. From a sustainability perspective, the Ukraine war could actually accelerate adoption of renewable energy and thus could stimulate the energy transition that is necessary to combat climate change.

This picture on this page was taken in Costa Rica, one of the biodiversity hotspots in the world. Biodiversity is important for sustainability of our natural world as well as for human health, and biodiversity experts warn that it is likely that pandemics like COVID-19 could occur more frequently unless we stop destroying nature.

Introduction committee


Hi first years! We are the intro committee and we organise your first week at Utrecht University, which will hopefully become one of your most memorable weeks at uni and with Storm!

STUDYING AT UTRECHT

Blackboard, Osiris, and other platforms

The first one sounds like a thriller series and the second one is an ancient Egyptian God. However, these two platforms will provide vital information for any student at UU. If you had an online platform in your high school (for dutch students; magister, Som, itslearning, etc.), it is probably comparable to Blackboard. You can also find an app in the AppStore or Playstore for Blackboard.

Blackboard will be your primary source of communication from your teachers. Here you will find all the things you need, hand in your assignments, and, most importantly, find your course manual. As an older student to an inexperienced one: "READ YOUR COURSE MANUAL!". This provides all the useful information you can wish for at the start of a semester. Second, to this, there is Osiris. This platform provides information about the courses and enables you to subscribe to them. Make sure to keep an eye on the subscription dates to make sure you can follow courses. Do not worry about the first period, the university already arranged that for you!

Other platforms useful for your time as a student are the myUU app and your Outlook account. Every student has an Outlook account which can be helpful to get in touch with each other and teachers. The myUU app shows your student card, study progression, and timetable for courses.


Important buildings and transport

There are many buildings in the Science Park, which will probably feel like a maze at first. But luckily you don't have to be in all buildings, in the first year it is mainly the **Ruppert building**, **Educatorium**, **Koningsbergergebouw** (**KBG**), and **Buys Ballotgebouw** (**BBG**). The nice thing about the science park is that many buildings are connected and you can therefore quickly move from one building to another. On the map below you can see where everything is. If it is not completely clear for you yet, do not worry. During the intro week, your mentor parents will give you a tour so that you can find everything quickly. From Utrecht Centraal, you can either go by bus 28 or by tram 22 towards Science Park. The bus and tram can be found at platform A and right next to it, which you can find by following the signs at the station. For both the bus and tram you can get out at stop 'Heidelberglaan' and the bus also stops at 'Botanische tuinen'.

STUDYING AT UTRECHT

Nice places to study

Unfortunately, being a student is not just fun, sometimes you will have to learn for an exam or do an assignment (could also be fun!). The university has many great places for you to study in a good environment. We have the UB (the university library), where you can find a seat in the 'free area', but you can also reserve rooms here to work on a project with multiple people. Book these in advance, otherwise, they will probably be occupied! KBG also has many nice study areas: there are places on the second floor where it is hushed, on the ground floor and on the first floor there are long tables which you can sit at, there are also group rooms and study booths here. In BBG and Minnaert there are different types of study rooms as well, and next to these in the Botanical Garden, you can find La Tentina, also a pretty and chill place to study while enjoying the weather! So all in all, there is more than enough, and you will soon find out what your best place to study is:))



HOW TO GET A BIKE

OV

Bike

For the introduction week, it's really important that you have access to a bike. If you don't have a bike, you can rent an OV bike from the NS. You can get these at the station or in the bicycle shed next to the Library of the Science Park. Make sure you have a personal OV-chipcard registered for OV-bike rental.

STEP 1: A personal OV-card

In order to register for the OV-bike rental you need a personal OV-card, which can also

be used for all public transport in the Netherlands. A personal OV-card just means that

the card directly correlates to you, with your name on the card. It will cost €7,50 once,

and after that you top up the balance on your card to travel with it, or to rent a bike, the card is valid for 5 years. It will take a few days to arrive, so make sure you have the card before the introduction week. With this link you can apply for a personal OV-card: https://

STEP 2: Register for OV-bike rental

To rent an OV-bike, you need to have a season ticket. By visiting the site https://www.

ns.nl/en/door-to-door/ov-fiets/how-it-works.html you can easily download this free OV- fiets season ticket online, and link it to your personal OV-card. Just follow the directions on the site. After this, you will be able to rent an OV-bike.

STEP 3: Renting the bike

Using the OV-bike costs €4,15 per 24 hour period. If you keep the OV-bike for longer,

then you are charged for additional rental periods (up to a maximum of 72 hours). For

time exceeding 72 hours you pay a 5 euro surcharge per 24 hours. Furthermore, if you

return your OV-bike to a different location than where you rented it, you will be charged a 10 euro fee. So make sure you return your bike on time and in the same location where you rented it.

HOW TO GET A BIKE

Swapfiets

If you do not have a bike yet and would want to rent one for a longer period of time, one option would be the Swapfiets where you can monthly rent a bike for a decent price. You can rent a normal bike with a student discount for $\in 16,90$ per month and for a deluxe bike you will pay $\in 21,90$ per month. You will have to show your student card, which you can see in the MyUU app. Swapfiets is trustworthy and reliable, and the advantage is that whenever the bike is in need of repair or gets stolen, Swapfiets will ensure that you have a (new) working bike within 48 hours.

Some notes regarding Swapfiets:

• You can choose to pay an extra €19,90 once to be able to terminate your rent


monthly, otherwise you have to rent for 6 months at a time

• The reparation costs are free

• They are available between 08:00 and 22:00 on weekdays, and between 09:00 and

18:00 on weekends.

Groentetas

Groentetas is an initiative that provides weekly bags full of locally produced vegetables and fruits that are seasonally grown. For only 7 euros per week, you can get this weekly "vegetable bag" and you can order and pick up your groentetas in the Educatorium canteen every Wednesday between 12:00 - 14:00. You should order your groentetas the latest Sunday evening for the following Wednesday. It's also possible to order the groentetas online! The groentetas is a great place to get all your locally grown, sustainable vegetables. It could even be the case that you discover vegetables you have never tried before or of which you didn't even know the existence of. If you like cooking it is a great way to get inspiration for new recipes. At the groentetas you always pay in advance so they order the right amount of bags, thus reducing food waste. If you are interested in helping out the groentetas and supporting local, sustainable vegetables you can always apply to be a volunteer or maybe even join the groentetas board. Both are a lot of fun and a great way to meet new people who are also interested in sustainability!





Do either the intro week or weekend cost any money?

Unfortunately, yes. To ensure we deliver you the best possible week of your life, a small contribution is necessary. For the week, this will be \leq 25. Since the week is obligatory, this contribution is also obligatory. The weekend is not obligatory and will cost a bit more as 2 nights and food and drinks are provided this weekend, this will be \leq 35.

What if I don't have a place to stay in Utrecht throughout the week?

Don't worry! You can always stay at one of your mentor parents' places. But make sure that you inform the committee and your mentor parents on the first day of the introduction week.

What if I have food allergies or specific dietary requirements?

Don't you worry! All meals prepared at Storm activities are 100% vegan, with vegetarian options. Besides that, you will need to fill in an information form when you arrive in your introduction group, where you can clarify any food allergies, so we are aware and can offer other options.

Where can I find the schedule of my courses?

You can download the free Utrecht University app (MyUU) where you can find the schedule of your courses. These will be available a few weeks before the course starts. When the schedules are not available on the MyUU app you can always check the course manuals on Blackboard. The course guides also provide a good overview of how the courses are planned and other information.

What if I suddenly fall ill during the week and cannot continue the Introduction Week activities anymore?

Let one of your mentor parents or one of the Introduction Committee members know the day before. If you miss one of the lectures or working groups from your university courses, you can look up the course manual on Blackboard to read what to do.

How can I find a room?

You can find a room by reacting to advertisements on Facebook. There are many groups on Facebook which you can join where people offer rooms in Utrecht. One of these groups is called 'Kamer in Utrecht', I would definitely recommend joining this one! Furthermore, you can register at www.sshxl.nl, which also offers rooms and has a one-time registration fee of €20,-.

How much do I have to study?

We cannot tell you how much you have to study because this is different per person, but the university bases its curriculum on 20 hours a week per course. Each period you will follow two courses at the same time, so it will be about 40 hours per week.
